2015-2016 small grants awarded

Donations from members and friends of nursing made it possible for 13 nurse researchers—selected from 93 applicants—to receive a 2015-2016 small research grant.

These researchers are focusing on a wide array of healthcare issues, including improving communications between healthcare providers and families, predicting nursing student success, weight management, and treatment of tuberculosis patients in South Africa. Open Research Grants

The Foundation works to attract support for nursing research grants. These grants are currently accepting applications:

- <u>STTI Evidence-Based Practice Implementation Grant</u> (US \$20,000)—
 Encourages nurses in clinical settings to apply evidence to practice and evaluate the effects on patient outcomes. Funding provided by Hill-Rom. Deadline 1 June 2016.
- Joan K. Stout, RN, Research Grant (up to US \$5,000)—To advance ongoing evidence-based study by nurse researchers on the impact of the practice of simulation education in schools of nursing and clinical care settings. Funding provided by the Hugoton Foundation. Deadline 1 July 2016.
- ATI Educational Assessment Nursing Research Grant (up to US \$6,000)— Supports research demonstrating the use of standardized assessments and curriculum support materials in nursing education. Funding provided by ATI Nursing Education. Deadline 1 July 2016.
