“Education for Global Citizenship: Empowering Our Interconnected World” was a side event during the [High-Level Political Forum \(HLPF\)](#). The forum was convened under the auspices of the [Economic and Social Council \(ECOSOC\)](#) and included a three-day ministerial meeting.
