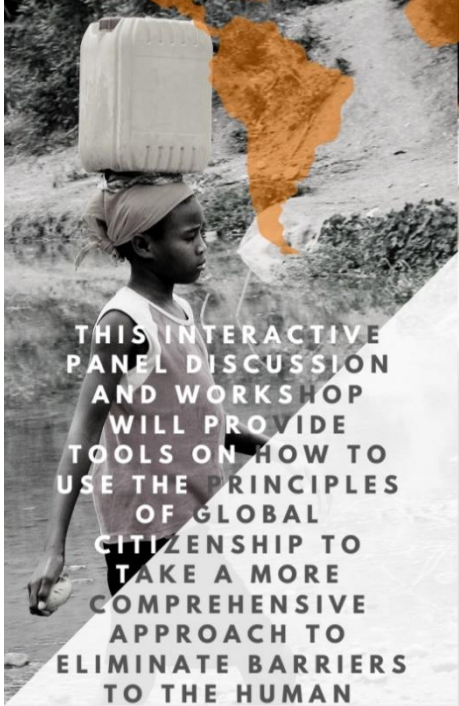

There was an interactive panel discussion and a workshop structure that provided tools on how to use the principles of global citizenship to take a more comprehensive approach to eliminate barriers to human rights for women, including ensuring their access to public services and strengthening protection floors. This meeting was followed by a reception hosted by CGC 2030 to continue the conversation and share innovative ideas.
