

UNITED NATIONS ACTIVITY REPORT

The 60th session of the <u>Commission on the Status of Women</u> took place at the United Nations Headquarters in New York from 14 to 24 March 2016.

The Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) is the principal global intergovernmental body exclusively dedicated to the promotion of gender equality and the empowerment of women. A functional commission of the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC), it was established by Council resolution 11(II) of 21 June 1946.

The following summary is from the reception for non-governmental delegates held on March 15, 2016 at the Rosenthal Pavilion, New York University, New York City, NY.
