Recruitment and Induction Resources

RECRUITMENT:

Member recruitment is a year-round process and should start long before a potential member is eligible to receive an invitation. HIGHLIGHT (CONTINUED)

INDUCTION:

After introducing your chapter to prospective members through recruitment, the next step is to issue invitations to those who meet Sigma membership eligibility criteria. Remember that invitations to join Sigma should never be a surprise to prospective members, so consider sending an <u>expectation email</u> before uploading their information into the Online Induction System (OIS).

Your chapter's induction is a special occasion because it is a continuation of the relationship-building between the candidate and your chapter. Plan adequate communication throughout the entire induction process. Those who accept the invitation to join should be informed of induction ceremony details and chapter involvement opportunities.

Sigma provides many tools and resources to help you plan, set up, and conduct a memorable induction ceremony for your new chapter members.

After the induction ceremony, don't forget to schedule a <u>new member orientation</u> to help new chapter members learn more about membership benefits and ways to stay engaged with your chapter and Sigma. Also, keep in mind prospective members who were invited but did not accept their invitation. There are several reasons why they may not respond to their invitation at that time, and they may be interested in joining at a later date.

Sigma reaches out several times a year to candidates who haven't yet accepted to remind them of the opportunity, but chapters are also encouraged to reach out, as there can be so much value in a personal message coming from a chapter leader. Here are resources to help chapters craft follow-up communications and continue to build a relationship with candidates.

If you are hoping to boost your acceptance rates this induction season, consider hosting | an in-person ceremony. Inductees are three times more likely to accept an invitation to an in-person ceremony vs. a no-ceremony and two times more likely to accept an invitation to in-person ceremony vs. a virtual ceremony.
